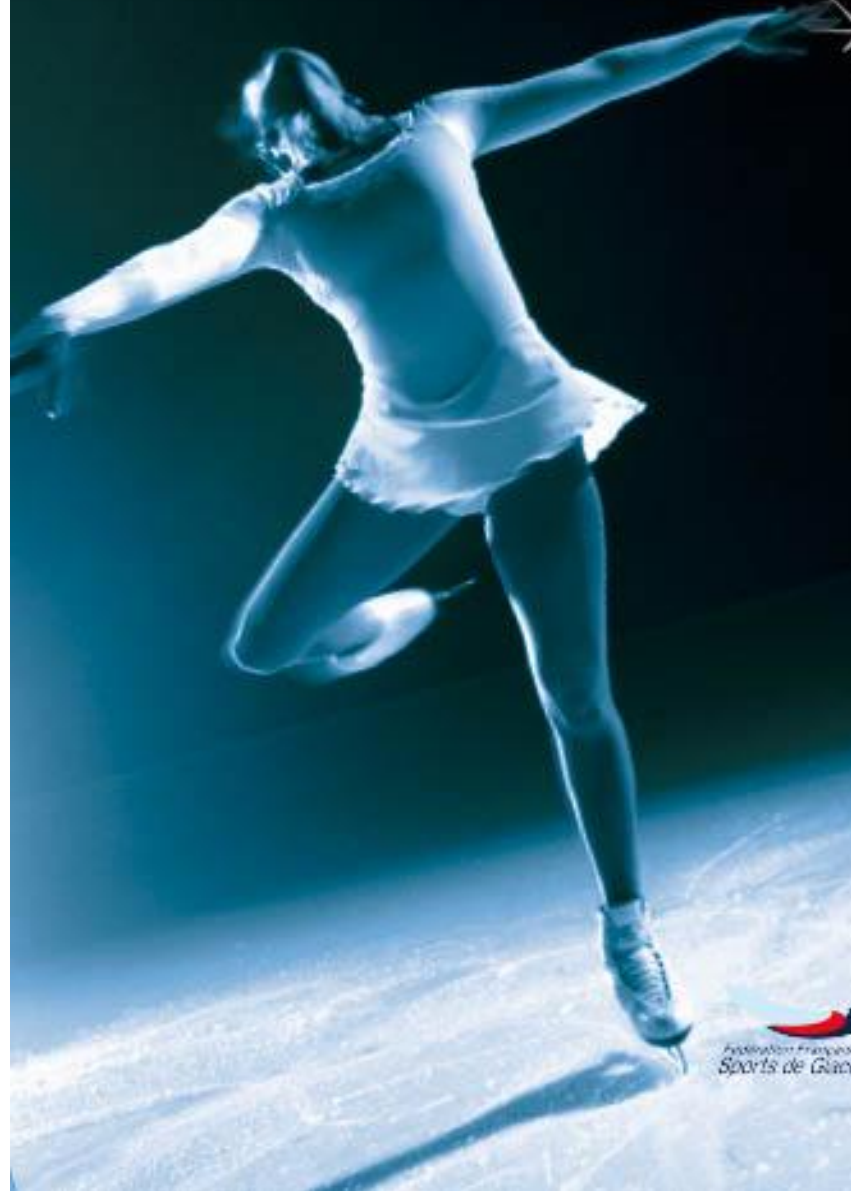

4. GENERAL REGULATIONS

The competition "**Rooster Cup**" will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2010, the ISU Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single and Pair Skating 2010 and ISU Communication n°1649, as well as pertinent ISU Communications.

All ISU Members / Clubs, which are members of National Figure Skating Federations associated with the ISU, are invited to take part in this competition.

The Advanced Novice Competitors must be entered through their respective Member Federation with a maximum of two skaters per category.

Entries for the other categories (Novice A, Cubs and Chicks) may be accepted by Clubs which are members of National Figure Skating Federations associated with ISU with a maximum of two skaters per category. The organizing committee reserves the right to give priority to Federations entering skaters in these categories. For the French Clubs the entries will be by FFSG, CSNPA or Invitation. The total number of entries will be limited to 140.

5. TECHNICAL DATA

5.1 Advanced Novices

Girls/Boys born between 01.07.1996 and 30.06.2001

Technical Rules - Novices ISU **communication n° 1649.**

Short Program : 2 min.30 sec. Max

Free Skating : Girls : 3 min (+/- 10 sec.)
Boys : 3 min 30 sec. (+/-10 sec.)

Short Program – Girls

- a) Axel Paulsen or double Axel Paulsen
- b) Double or triple jump immediately proceeded by connecting steps, may not repeat jump in a)
- c) One jump combination consisting of two double jumps or one double and one triple, both jumps may not repeat jump in a) or b)
- d) Layback or sideways leaning spin (minimum of six (6) revolutions)
- e) Spin combination with only one change of foot and at least one change of position (minimum of five(5) revolutions on each foot)
- f) One step sequence with full utilization of the ice surface (straight line, serpentine/circular)

Short Program – Boys

- g) Axel Paulsen or double Axel Paulsen
- h) Double or triple jump immediately proceeded by connecting steps, may not repeat jump in a)
- i) One jump combination consisting of two double jumps or one double and one triple, both jumps may not repeat jump in a) or b)
- j) Camel or sit spin (minimum of six (6) revolutions) with change of foot and no flying entrance
- k) Spin combination with only one change of foot and at least one change of position (minimum of five(5) revolutions on each foot)
- l) One step sequence with full utilization of the ice surface (straight line, serpentine/circular)

Girls and Boys

A well balanced Free Skating program must contain :

- a) Maximum of 6 jump elements for Girls and 7 jump elements for Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. A Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence can contain any number of jumps, but only two most difficult jumps will be counted.
Only two (2) jumps with two and a half (2½) or more revolutions can be repeated either in a jump combination or in a jump sequence.

- b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature, one of which must be a spin combination (minimum of ten (10) revolutions in total), and one a flying spin or a spin with a flying entrance (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total).

- c) There must be a maximum of one (1) step sequence.

Levels explanations:

For Advanced Novices, in all elements which are subject to Levels, only features up to **Level 3** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Transitions
- Performance/Execution
- Interpretation

The Factor of the Program Components is :

- a) Short Program
 - For Girls 1,0
 - For Boys 1,0

- b) Short Program
 - For Girls 1,5
 - For Boys 1,7

4.2 Basic Novices A

Girls and Boys born between 01.07.1998 and 30.06.2001

Technical Rules Novices ISU **communication n° 1649.**

Free Skating : Girls and Boys 2 min 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

Girls and Boys

A well balanced Free Skating program must contain :

- a) Maximum of 4 jump elements for Girls and Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. Jump combinations can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence can contain any number of jumps, but only two most difficult jumps will be counted.
Triple jumps are not permitted.

- b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total), and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total).

- c) There must be a maximum :
 - For Girls one (1) step sequence or one (1) spiral sequence consisting of maximum two (2) spiral positions. The sequence (step or spirals) will have a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.
 - For Boys maximum of one (1) step sequence with a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Performance/Execution

The Factor of the Program Components is 2.5

Levels explanations:

For Basic Novice A, in all elements which are subject to Levels, only features up to **Level 2** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

4.3 Cubs -10 Girls and Boys born between 01.07.2001 and 30.06.2003

and

4.4 Chicks - 8 Girls and Boys born between 01.07.2003 and 30.06.2005

Free Skating : Girls and Boys 2 min 30 sec. (+/- 10 sec.)

Girls and Boys

A well balanced Free Skating program must contain :

- a) Maximum of 4 jump elements for Girls and Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. Jump combinations can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence can contain any number of jumps, but only two most difficult jumps will be counted.
Triple jumps are not permitted.
Only two (2) jumps with two (2) or more revolutions can be repeated either in a jump combination or in a jump sequence.

- b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total), and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total).

- c) There must be a maximum :
 - For Girls one (1) step sequence or one (1) spiral sequence consisting of maximum two (2) spiral positions. The sequence (step or spirals) will have a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.
 - For Boys maximum of one (1) step sequence with a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Performance/Execution

The Factor of the Program Components is 2.5

Deduction : 0,5 by Fall

Levels explanations:

For Chicks and Cubs, in all elements which are subject to Levels, only features up to **Level 2** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

6. ENTRIES

Entry Forms should be used

The Advanced Novice Competitors must be entered through their respective Member Federation with a maximum of two skaters per category.

Entries for the other categories (Novice A, Cubs and Chicks) may be accepted by Clubs which are members of National Figure Skating Federations associated with ISU with a maximum of two skaters per category. The organizing committee reserves the right to give priority to Federations entering skaters in these categories.

6.3 Entries of Judges

Each participating ISU Member is kindly requested to nominate **one (1)** ISU/International Judge and one substitute Judge.

Each panel of Judges will consist of 5 Judges. In case of a too high number of entered judges, the Organizing Committee will make a draw and inform the ISU Members by electronic mail before March 12th 2012 whether judges have been drawn or not.

The official Entry Form for Judges must reach the Organizing Committee to e.louesdon@neuf.fr , not later than **Saturday, March 10th, 2012**.

7. MEALS, LODGING AND TRAVEL EXPENSES

The organizer will provide and cover the expenses for rooms and meals for accepted Judges and invited Officials participating, beginning with lunch on **Thursday, April 26th, 2012** until breakfast **Monday, April 30th, 2012**.

The organizer will provide and cover the expenses for travel (based on economy fare), rooms and meals for the invited Referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists, and Data & Replay Operators.

The expenses for travel, rooms and meals for Competitors, Team Leaders and Coaches will not be covered by the organizer.

8. PRACTICE

8.1 Official Practice

Official Practice for Competitors begins on **Thursday, April 26, 2012, morning**. The details schedule will be issued at the time of registration.

8.2 Unofficial Practice

Unofficial Practices are available Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday by special appointment at a cost of 15,00 € (Euro) per session (50 minutes) and per skater.

9. MUSIC

All competitors shall furnish competition music of excellent quality on CD format.

In accordance with Rule 343, paragraph1, all discs must show the Competition event, Competitor's name, the Nation and the exact running time of the music (not skating time) including any starting signal and must be submitted at the time of registration. Each program (short program, free skating) must be recorded on a separate CD. In addition competitors must provide a back-up CD for each program.

All music will be returned to the Skater at the end of the competition, in the "Kiss and Cry"

10. PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

With the entry forms, the "Program Content Sheet" must be returned to the Organizing Committee in time. It is mandatory that the Program Content Sheet must be filled in precisely by each Skater in English using the terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication.

11. ACCREDITATION

The official accreditation is planned at **the Ice Rink** upon arrival

12. PRESENTATION OF MEDALS

The first three best placed Competitors in each event will be announced and honored. Trophies and Gifts will be presented to the medalists. The national anthem of the winner will be played.

Each Skater will receive a medal in the kiss and cry after her/his performance.

13. ANTI-DOPING CONTROLS

Anti-doping tests may be carried out in accordance with the current ISU Anti-Doping Rules & Procedures (ISU communications n° 1650 and 1651 or any further update of this communication) and the French Ministry.

14. INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Rule 119, it is the sole responsibility of each Member participating in the Rooster Cup, to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means of the ill or injured person.

The Organizer assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage incurred in connection incurred by Competitors or Officials. The Organizer will provide Medical Emergency Aid during the Competition.

15. OPENING DRAW

The opening draw will be automatic via a computer draw. The timetable will be available on www.cocpatinage.org

16. PARIS CITY TOUR

A free bus will be provided to visit Paris.
